I encourage all families to talk to their children about 'Positivity' and what they are learning regarding this in their class.

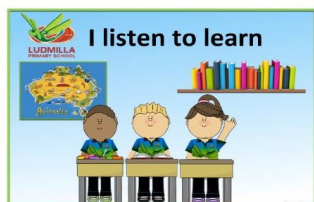
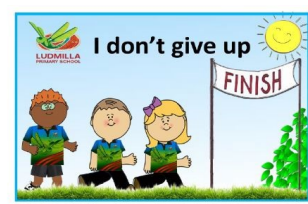
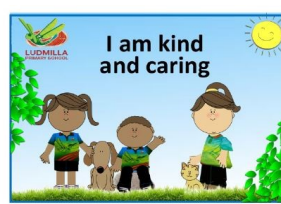
