Just before 10am on 19 February 1942, 188 Japanese aircraft appeared over Darwin. The aircraft had taken off from four aircraft carriers in the Timor Sea. The air raid sirens were sounded too late to give much warning. The Japanese bombed the wharf and ships moored in the harbour. Six large vessels were sunk and another 14 ships were damaged.
